## Camping

**Camping Superintendents:** Gregg Sproull

If registration and payment is received before May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022 the camper/tent is eligible for set-up on the Wednesday before the fair. If registration and payment is received after May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022 the camper/tent is eligible for set-up on the Friday before the fair. The Agricultural Society will make every effort to assign the same spot from the previous year. If your registration and payment is not received by May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022 you will not be guaranteed to receive the same spot from the previous year. If you have not received an assigned spot, please go to the office or contact one of the directors below before setting up your camper/tent.

- Power and water will be supplied beginning **June 18<sup>th</sup>, 2022.**
- **No campers will be permitted to set up before June 15<sup>th</sup>, 2022.**
- All vehicles must park in designated Fair Parking Areas.
- An adult must accompany all minors in the campers and tents. No exceptions.
- All occupants of the camper/tent (excluding Jr. Fair participants) must purchase a Week Long Fair Pass.

## Fairground Notices

***No alcoholic beverages are permitted on the fairgrounds .***

No person shall be permitted to make solicitations of any nature on the fairgrounds except in contracted concession or commercial spaces. No helium shall be used to inflate balloons distributed on the fairgrounds. **NO ANIMALS** of any kind are permitted on the fairgrounds except those involved directly with the Harrison County Fair.

Three wheelers, four wheelers, motorcycles and golf carts must be parked in designated areas and are **NOT PERMITTED** on the fairgrounds without an official vehicle sign from the Agricultural Society President or Secretary.

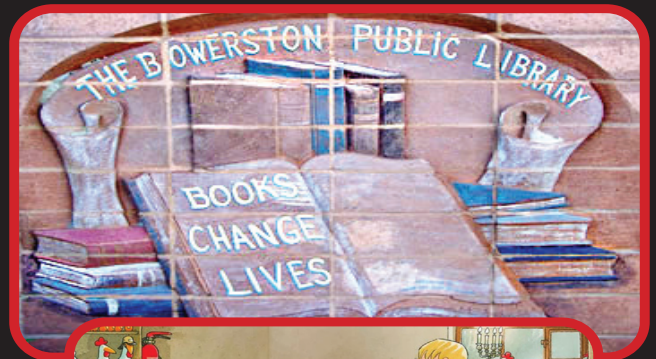

**Superintendent:** Lynette Dauch • **Judging:** Tuesday, June 21<sup>st</sup>

Entries can be made by mail or at the Sr. Fair Office. Refer to office hours in the front of the book. Entry fees may be paid at time of registration or when exhibits are received. Entries will close at 6 p.m. on the Sunday before the fair.

*Exhibits will be received in the Commercial Building 1:00 p.m.–6:00 p.m. on the Sunday before the fair and 9:00 - 3:00 p.m. the Monday of the fair.*

### Rules

1. Entries are open to residents of Harrison County and any other county or state.
2. No Week Long Pass is required by the exhibitor.
3. Exhibitor can make only one entry in each class unless entry is of a different variety.
4. All varieties in each class will be judged separately.
5. All canned meats, fruits and vegetables will be judged on appearance only.
6. No product, if considered by judge to be unworthy, will be given a premium, whether there is competition or not. Decision of the judge is final.
7. The Harrison County Agricultural Society will take due cautions but cannot be responsible for damage or loss.
8. All products must be grown between January 2022–July 2022 by the exhibitor.
9. Judges reserve the right to award “Best of Show” to any division.
10. Exhibitors can remove their entries from the department after 9:00 p.m. on the Saturday of the fair. The Agricultural Society will not be responsible for any items remaining after 12:01 a.m. on Sunday.
12. Exhibitors are asked to donate items in Divisions E–J for the auction on the Wednesday of the fair at 4:00 p.m. If the exhibitor wishes to donate his/her entry for the auction, please provide two jars—one for display and one for the auction.
13. Please note on entry tag if you want to keep your premium ribbon.

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# Harrison County Agricultural Society Constitution & By-Laws

**ARTICLE I** This organization shall be known by the name of the Harrison County Agricultural Society.

**ARTICLE II** The object of this society shall be to promote and encourage Agriculture, Horticultural, Industry, Science and the raising of better livestock; to encourage School, Junior Fair Exhibits and all educational features which help to build a better community .

**ARTICLE III** The Board of Directors shall consist of fifteen members whose term or office shall be three years, one third of whom shall be elected annually from the county at large.

**ARTICLE IV** The annual election of members for the Board of Directors shall be held on the last Saturday of annual fair, between the hours of 1:00 – 5:00 p.m., place specified in the annual premium list, also in the election notice published in a county newspaper of general circulation two weeks prior to the election and elected by the membership of the Society of the county.

**ARTICLE V** To obtain a membership ticket any person paying the Secretary/Treasurer the required fee (\$5 .00) will be issued a membership ticket. The card of membership entitles the member of 18 years of age and older and a Harrison County resident to vote at the annual election of Directors.

**ARTICLE VI** Membership tickets can be purchased from the Secretary/Treasurer of the Society from September 1st through August 31st. All voting must be done in accordance with the law pertaining to County Fairs. The casting of votes for Directors by Proxy will not be permitted.

**ARTICLE VII** Members of the Agricultural Society must declare their candidacy for the office of Director, by filing with the Secretary of the Society a petition signed by ten or more current members of the Society by 9:00 p.m. on the Friday before the annual fair, but not earlier than 6 weeks before the annual fair.

**ARTICLE IX** In case a vacancy shall arise in the Board by death, resignation or otherwise, the Board has the power to fill the vacancy by appointment until the next election.

**ARTICLE X** The Board of Directors shall at the September meeting each year elect a President, Vice-president, Secretary and Treasurer. The Secretary shall give a bond to be approved by the Board in the sum of \$500; the Treasurer to give a like bond in the sum of \$2,000.

**ARTICLE XI** All officers are to hold their offices until their successors are elected and qualified. Election of officers shall be by ballot.

**ARTICLE XII** No membership certificates shall be issued to corporations, partnerships or firms. All membership certificates shall be issued in the name of an individual who has paid the required fee .

**ARTICLE XIII** Amendments or alterations to the constitution of this Society may be adopted by a majority vote of the membership voting at the annual election of the Board of Directors .

**ARTICLE XIV** The regular meeting of the Board of Directors shall be the first Monday of each month at the Fair Office at the Fairgrounds.

**ARTICLE XV** Any eight members of the Board of Directors constitute a quorum for the transaction of business .

**ARTICLE XVI** If any member of the Board of Directors misses three consecutive regular meetings due to unexcused absence, the Board may declare his position vacant and name a successor to serve until the next election, when a Director shall be elected for the unexpired term .

**ARTICLE XVII** It shall be the duty of the President to preside at all meetings for the Society and discharge such duties as pertain to his office and in his absence the Vice President shall discharge the duties of his office.

**ARTICLE XVIII** The Board of Directors shall fix the date for the annual FAIR of the Society subject to the approval of the Ohio Director of Agriculture.

## MISCELLANEOUS

1. Entry fees must be paid at the time of making entries . All animals or articles must be in place and ready for exhibition on the first day of the fair.

2. The treasurer shall have general charge of tickets and gates during the fair .

3. The premiums are designated by ribbons: **First Place**—Blue, **Second Place**—Red, **Third Place**—White, **Fourth Place**—Yellow .

4. The Secretary and Treasurer shall have the right to vote on all questions submitted to a vote of the Board .

5. All exhibitors of stock are required to post a card on stalls or pens occupied by stock containing the name and address of the exhibitor and also proper card must be attached to animals and articles exhibited .

6. All livestock competing for premiums must be in condition for exhibition .

7. Entries can be made by mail by forwarding to **Harrison County Agriculture Society P.O . Box 274, Cadiz, OH 43907**, the number and kind of article or stock to be exhibit- ed, accompanied by the proper entry fee and fee for season pass .

8. The Society assumes no liability for any accident occurring on the grounds during the fair, but will do everything possible to avoid them .

9. The Board of Directors reserves the right to make any additional classes that they think is for the betterment of the fair .

- (A) **Agent**—means any person who is employed, whether or not paid in any manner, by a concessionaire to work in any game or novelty stand at a fair.
- (B) **Amusement**—means an entertainment that is applied to activities, where no prize or where equal prizes are given by the operator to each participant, whether or not the object is accomplished. An example may include, but is not limited to, electronic arcades, or any pleasurable activity where a player places a stake, in the anticipation of little or no reward.
- (C) **Concession**—means an activity that is required to be licensed under the authority of section 1711.11 of the Revised Code.
- (D) **Concessionaire**—means any person who owns, operates, or leases a concession and has obtained a license from the department.
- (E) **Department**—means the Ohio Department of Agriculture.
- (F) **Director**—means the Director of the Department
- (G) **Fair**—means the annual exposition conducted by any county or independent agricultural society or the Ohio Expositions Commission.
- (H) **Group Games**—are those games where the skill of one or more players is pitted against the skills of other players playing the same game simultaneously.
- (I) **Inspector**—means any person employed by the department or under contract with the department, the director or the director's designee, assigned to work at county or independent fairs or the Ohio State Fair for the purpose of inspecting games, shows and sales of novelties .
- (J) **Novelty**—means any inexpensive souvenirs for sale that list the Fair's name and/or logo and are approved for souvenir sale by the county or independent agricultural society or by the Ohio expositions commission.
- (K) **Novelty Stand**—means a location at a fair from which novelties are sold.
- (L) **Person**—means any individual, partnership, corporation or agent of the same, acting either individually, or as a group, in any manner covered by this chapter.
- (M) **Player**—means any person who plays a game at a fair whether or not he is attempting to win a prize.
- (N) **Prize**—means any item won by a player of a game at a fair upon completion of some task.
- (O) **Show**—means an exhibition or demonstrative display, but not a grandstand or other fair-sponsored event.

### FARM STOCK (ONLY ONE DRIVER PER TRACTOR)

No sign-ups for a particular class after the first hook of the class

Everyone on the grounds must sign a waiver.

First puller in class has option to drop.

No alcoholic beverages permitted on the fairgrounds.

No "hot rodding" on fairgrounds. If caught "hot rodding" or with alcoholic beverages, you will be escorted off the grounds.

Only drivers are permitted on the tractor at all times. All other safety and common sense pulling rules apply.

Pullers under the age of 16 must be accompanied by parent or legal guardian. Registered driver for particular class must be at the wheel when tractor is checked.

Hanging weights cannot interfere with sled's hitching chain or otherwise obstruct/impede hooking/ unhooking process.

**Hitch:** Must be stationary in all directions, 20 inch maximum height, 18 inch minimum length from center of rear axle to the center of hitch hole. Hole must be at least 3 inches wide and 3 3/4 inches long to accept sled hook.

**Chassis:** Tractor must have rock shaft housing, if factory equipped.

**Intake:** No water, alcohol or other oxygen accelerant permitted.

**Injection Pump:** Stock appearing. No inline pumps unless factory equipped.



### FARM STOCK (must be stock appearing) Antique

**Weight Classes:** 4500, 5500, 7500

**Tires:** 18.4x38 limit, AG Tires and radials allowed

**Hitch:** Must be stationary, all directions, 20 inch maximum height, 18 inch minimum length from center of rear axle to the center of hitch hole. Hole must be at least 3 inches wide and 3 3/4 inches long to accept sled hook.

**Chassis:** Tractor must have rock shaft housing, if factory equipped. Must have 2 of the 3 PTTO, HYD, or 3 PT.

**Intake:** No water, alcohol or other oxygen accelerant permitted.

### FARM STOCK (Must be stock appearing)

**Classes:** 9500/11,500/12,500/ 14,000

Tractor must have OEM style engine and OEM style pump.

**Tires:** AG Tires and radials are permitted.

**Hitch:** Must be stationary, 20 inch maximum height, 18 inch minimum length from center of rear axle to the center of hitch hole.

Hole must be at least 3 inches wide and 3 3/4 inches long to accept sled hook.

**Chassis:** Tractor must have rock shaft housing, if factory equipped. No Hot Farm

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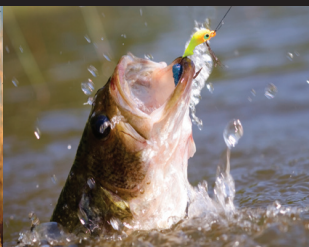

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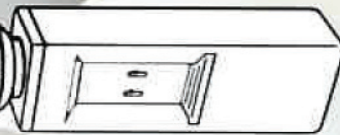
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
